

The 2003 John H. Lyons, Sr., Scholarship Program

The scholarship program honoring the memory of the late General President John H. Lyons, Sr., has helped numerous sons and daughters of Ironworkers to attend college.

The sons and daughters of Ironworkers compete each year for four four-year scholarships. The original amount was raised from \$2,500 per year to \$5,000 per year.

Requests for application forms are now being accepted until January 31, 2003.

Scholarship Rules

1. Only sons and daughters of members or deceased members (who were in good standing at the time of their death) of the International Association of Bridge, Structural, Ornamental and Reinforcing Iron Workers who are presently in their senior year of high school are eligible to compete for the Scholarship.

2. Applicant must be a child, stepchild, or adopted child of a member of the International Association who has five or more years of continuous membership in the Association and who is an active member at the time of their child's application. Grandchildren are not eligible to apply. The brother or sister of a scholarship recipient is not eligible to apply.

3. Applicants should rank in the upper half of their graduating class.

4. Scholarship awards are competitive and will be based on:

- Academic standing of the student during their four years in high school
- College entrance examination scores (SAT or ACT)
- Extracurricular activities and leadership
- Character reference and citizenship

5. A scholarship winner may attend any accredited college or university of his/her choice in the United States or Canada and must be enrolled in a full-time program leading toward a degree.

6. Scholarships will be awarded for one year

and may be renewed for three academic years following the academic year for which the original scholarship was awarded. Whether or not a scholarship shall be renewed will be determined by the Scholarship Committee on the basis of applicant's scholastic record and conduct and the status of applicant's parent or guardian. The applicant's parent must remain in good standing in the International Association for the period of the scholarship.

7. The awards will be made payable to the selected applicants.

8. Applicants shall submit a complete application within the specified deadline.

9. In judging scholarship applications, the Awards Committee shall select a list of alternates. Such alternates shall be eligible in the order of their selection for scholarships in the event that one or more of the applicants should be unable to accept a scholarship award at the time of initial selection.

10. If the scholarship recipient's schooling is interrupted by either illness or military service, the continuation of said scholarship will be at the discretion of the Trustees.

11. Prior to changing schools the scholarship recipient must secure the approval of the Trustees of the Scholarship Foundation to insure the continuation of the scholarship.
